A focus on critical thinking and problem-solving processes associated with producing effective technical artifacts in scientific, business, and technological fields.
- **LMC 3403: Technical Communication – Special & Linked Section (1 Section)**
Siri's Progeny: Voice and the Future of Interaction Design. This course links the first-year composition and technical communication curricula by exploring the hierarchy of the senses and questions of speech in human-computer interaction design.

This course offers an innovative and comprehensive multidisciplinary approach to providing students with a real-world project-based experience
